




The French Bob

The French Bob

- 1) Starting at the nape, blunt cut the first section to the desired length. Be sure to keep the hair fully saturated throughout the entire haircut!
- 2) Moving up the back, create slight graduation by elevating each back section using the first blunt cut as your guide.
- 3) Continue creating slight graduation up the back of the head and switch to a razor once you let the crown section down to cut.
- 4) Remove weight where needed using vertical sections for added texture.
- 5) Slightly overdirect the side sections back and connect them to the perimeter.
- 6) Let the tip sections down and continue holding slight elevation and using a razor to cut this section to length.
- 7) Cut fringe section as desired using a triangle parting.
